



Sculptra FAQ

What is Sculptra?

Sculptra is an injectable collagen stimulator made up of poly-L-lactic acid. It helps restore facial skin structure and provides long-lasting skin improvement.

Sculptra is unlike Hyaluronic Acid fillers that work to fill lines and wrinkles. Sculptra works by stimulating collagen to restore skin foundation.

What does Sculptra treat?

Sculptra is used to correct wrinkles and folds in the face. It can treat areas such as

- Smile lines, or deep folds from corners of the nose to mouth (nasolabial folds)
- Lines below corners of the mouth (marionette lines)
- Temples
- Cheek wrinkles

How many treatments do I need?

On average, you will have 2-3 sessions of Sculptra over the course of a few months. We typically recommend starting with 2 sessions spaced 6 weeks apart, depending on the area being treated.

When will I see results?

Most patients have seen results 1 month post treatment, with sustained results up to 2 years.

94% of patients had an improved appearance 2 years after treatment.

What should I do after my treatment?

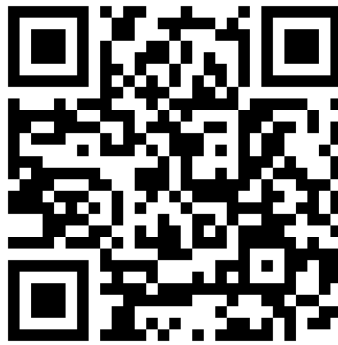
Massage the treated area to evenly distribute Sculptra after it is injected. A good rule of thumb is 5-5-5: massage the injected area for 5 minutes, 5 times a day, for 5 days in a row starting the day of treatment. This increases results and is a very component of the treatment.

What is the cost?

Sculptra is priced at \$850 per vial. Ask your provider about any specials or packages if more than one vial is recommended.

Is there any downtime?

You may experience soreness and bruising around the injection site, and swelling and tenderness at the treated area. You may take Tylenol for any discomfort, and apply a topical Arnica cream to help with bruising.



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
